Employing 2,500 staff, serving 13,000 people and with 12,000 members and supporters, Enable is one of the largest non-public sector employers in Scotland.

We work for an equal society where everyone has the right to live, work and participate in the communities of their choice.

I am pleased to present Enable's 2023/24 Annual Review, in the year in which we celebrate our 70th anniversary. 2024 marked our ninth consecutive year of growth in impact and influence as a leading charity advocating for diversity, equity, and inclusion. We expanded our reach, focused on frontline investment, and pursued excellence in social care, employability, and campaigns.

In May 2024, we hosted the Europe in Action conference in Glasgow, bringing together 450 delegates from 40 countries to further disability inclusion efforts globally. Enable's values remain steadfast, aligned with the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, and continue to guide our work.

Enable Cares is one of Scotland's largest and most successful social care providers, offering support through our unique PA Model.

This model allows individuals to fully shape and control their chosen outcomes; from developing their bespoke service designs, to recruiting their own individualised team of Personal Assistants (PAs). Our PA Model empowers every person we work for to access their right to self-directed social care support.

Backed by a strong digital infrastructure, Enable Cares supports 1,000+ people to live independently in the community they choose, close to those they love.



Enable Communities is the member-led campaigning charity at the heart of Enable.

We lead the charge in supporting individuals with learning disabilities to be self-advocates, working at the individual, community, and national levels to drive meaningful change.

We work to make communities welcoming and supportive, allowing individuals to access their rights and opportunities by facilitating self-advocacy forums and community groups to give people the chance to be active community members and drive change for a more equal society.

Fundraising

Enable Communities is the beating heart of the charity, with our commitment to fundraise supported by members, colleagues and supporters.

In 2023/2024, our supporters stepped up to raise a phenomenal £17,500 by taking on the Kiltwalk in Glasgow, Aberdeen, Dundee and Edinburgh.

We are extremely grateful to our volunteer fundraisers, corporate supporters, Kiltwalk Ambassadors and everyone who helped us to achieve this phenomenal sum.

The Enable Lottery continues to be popular with our members and supporters, and is expected to raise around £13,000 per year for Enable's charitable projects and services.

Every ticket purchased makes a big difference, and players have shared over £12,000 in prizes to date – with every ticket in with a chance of winning the £25,000 jackpot!

In 2024, we celebrated 70 years of action by co-hosting a major international conference, Europe in Action with Inclusion Europe bringing over 450 delegates from 40 countries to Glasgow.

We shared our experiences and learning, and met with self-advocates and campaigners from across Europe during Scottish Learning Disability Week.
