This model allows individuals to fully shape and control their chosen outcomes; from developing bespoke service designs to recruiting their own individualised team of Personal Assistants (PAs). Our PA Model empowers every person we work for to self-determine where, how and with whom they live their lives.

Backed by a strong digital infrastructure, Enable Cares supports 1,200 people to live independently in the community they choose, close to those they love.

Enable Works is the leading provider of employability support in Scotland. Specialising in supporting disabled people and people with long term health conditions, we moved 1,500 people into sustainable, meaningful employment in the last year.

We design and deliver tailored programmes that build confidence, skills, and long-term employability for individuals, while partnering with employers to meet evolving workforce needs.

Through our inclusive recruitment expertise, targeted interventions, and strong employer networks, we create pathways into work and deliver sector-leading sustainability outcomes that are economically and socially transformative for communities across Scotland.

Our flagship Breaking Barriers programme is delivered by Enable Works, connecting young disabled people with world-class universities and leading global employers to create clear pathways into education and sustainable careers.

Energising Communities through Action and Advocacy

Enable Communities is the member-led campaigning pillar at the heart of Enable.

Our community projects make human rights real in everyday life. Our adults' and Enable Youth groups connect people, reduce loneliness, and create safe spaces to share experiences, learn and build friendships.

Access for All supports organisations to deliver inclusion in sport, culture, and social activities, putting Article 30 of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD) into practice. Self-Directed support information and LAC projects empower families, carers, and individuals to access their rights and take control of their support.

Our member-led campaigns, *Rights Now!* and *Enable the Vote*, support people with learning disabilities to collectively use their voices to shape national policy and push for stronger accountability and better implementation of human rights, incorporating UNCRPD into Scots Law.

Enable Communities empowers self-advocates to take action, build more inclusive communities, and makes human rights real for everyone.

Fundraising

Go the Distance to Make the Difference

In 2024/25, our supporters stepped up to raise a phenomenal £17,000 by taking on the Kiltwalk in Glasgow, Aberdeen, Dundee and Edinburgh. We are extremely grateful to our volunteer fundraisers, corporate supporters, colleagues and everyone who helped us to achieve this phenomenal sum.

A variety of thrilling events and challenging activities were introduced such as sky dives, ziplines across the Clyde, Tough Mudder, Inflatable 5K, and abseils off the Falkirk Wheel, to enable our fundraisers to raise an incredible £56,000.

The Enable Lottery continues to be popular with our members and supporters, and raises around £12,000 per year for Enable's charitable projects and services.

Every ticket purchased makes a big difference, and players have shared **over £16,000** in prizes to date – with every ticket in with a chance of winning the **£25,000 jackpot**.

As co-chair of the Self-Advocacy Forum, I see people with learning disabilities standing up and saying: 'I Am Here.' They are showing it through breakthroughs in travel, confidence in the community, and participation in sport and culture. Enoch, who joined the Breaking Barriers programme to develop his communication and social skills, quickly grew in confidence and built strong friendships with his peers. He is now exploring a career in gardening, having gained clarity about his future through the programme, as his mum explains:



It demystified the world of work and it shows that in the workplace some people are embracing diversity which is good to know. Before now, he couldn't get into any programme and he felt rejected, but since this programme his confidence has grown. He knows if he puts in the effort, he is able to achieve something good. I see him smiling all the time and I'm happy and grateful to Enable and the Breaking Barriers programme. It has been a truly inclusive journey for us."
